

MUNOG Artificial Intelligence (AI) Usage Policy

Adopted into the Rules of Procedure of MUNOG 2026

Dear participants of MUNOG 2026,

as technology is rapidly evolving, the use of artificial intelligence (AI) has become more accessible to all of us. While it can be a powerful tool, Model United Nations conferences are designed to foster critical thinking, independent research, and authentic debate. MUNOG 2026 is committed to ensuring a fair and intellectually honest environment for all its participants. The following policy outlines the permitted and prohibited use of AI tools by delegates and chairs.

Policy for Delegates

Delegates are strictly prohibited from using AI tools such as ChatGPT, Claude, Microsoft Copilot, Google Gemini and similar platforms to create official documents or speeches. This includes, but is not limited to, position papers, working papers, draft resolutions, as well as opening speeches or other speeches during debate.

Delegates may use electronic devices only while delivering a speech. During questions, points of information, and other forms of direct interaction, all electronic devices must be closed or turned off.

The Chairs shall have the final authority regarding the enforcement and interpretation of this rule. Depending on the conduct and cooperation of the delegates, the Chairs may, at their discretion, ease or further restrict these regulations. Any such adjustments shall apply as determined by the Chairs and may be introduced at any point during the conference to ensure a fair, focused, and productive debate.

Additionally, chairs are authorized to conduct random checks using AI-detection software, such as GPTZero, to assess the authenticity of submitted texts.

Any document flagged as more than 75 percent likely to be AI-generated will prompt a direct conversation between the chairs and the delegate who submitted the text. Based on this discussion and further assessment, the chairs may decide to exclude the document from further use in committee sessions.

Other violations, such as the proven use of AI tools without disclosure, will result in formal consequences. A first offense will result in a punishment and a 30-minute suspension of all electronic devices. During this time, all devices must be handed in to the Chairs. If a second offense occurs, or if the Chairs have reasonable grounds to suspect that a delegate has used AI in violation of these regulations, the incident shall be reported to the PGAs or the Secretary-General. In such cases, the Chairs may confiscate the delegate's electronic devices and, in consultation with the PGAs or the Secretary-General, determine the appropriate course of action, including whether the delegate will be excluded from consideration for all awards.

Final decisions regarding violations and sanctions shall be made in consultation with the Chairs of the respective committee, the PGAs, and the Secretary-General.

Policy for Chairs

Chairs may use AI tools at their discretion for administrative and organizational purposes only. Chairs are not permitted to use AI to evaluate delegate performance or generate feedback.

➔ We **urge** all delegates to enforce this policy, as it is **essential to uphold academic integrity** and **safeguard** the learning objectives of MUNOG. We trust the honesty and sense of **responsibility** of our participants to **ensure authentic diplomacy** throughout the conference.
